
Producer's Note

One might expect a musical full of Dr. Seuss tales to be lighthearted and fun, but maybe that's the naivety of childhood sneaking up on us. Stories that seem to be fun and innocent to us as children are much deeper than they appear on the surface. That's probably why they're so enduring and meaningful even to adults. Good children's literature often has the effect of making the child smile and laugh while making the adult want to cry. Seussical presents this beautifully in a parade (or perhaps a circus) of lonely people lost in the universe.

On the one hand is the innocence of childhood. Anything's possible for Jojo! On the other hand, we see the burden of adult responsibility for Horton. That's growing up in a nutshell: potential becomes reality; possibility becomes fact, and a few of our dreams are bought at the cost of the rest of our dreams. Horton sacrifices his reputation, comfort, and time to care for the little ones who depend on him, be they Who or Egg. Yet, armed with his convictions and his love, he perseveres, and he is willing to endure all for the sake of those whom he protects. What an image of Christ to his Church! What an image of parents to their child! The hope of Solla Sollew—the hope of the resurrection—does not lessen the importance of our loving service to our neighbors, nor does responsibility take away from our peace and hope in Christ's resurrection.

In the end, Jojo too must take up the burden of responsibility, as he is the only one who can. Yet, even after all is resolved, Jojo's growth is not into mere resignation; he retains forever the essence of childhood and imagination. A necessary tragedy of growing up is losing the inner child, but it is also true that the most fulfilled adults are the ones who can recapture and retain that primal imagination, curiosity, and wonder. Men and women are made in God's image, and our love of creating things is certainly part of that.
